

# NJDOH Public Health Recommendations for K-12 Schools - 2021-2022 School Year

### **Key Points or Updates:**

#### 1. Masks:

Masks must be worn indoors by staff, students, and visitors in all situations except as delineated in EO 251. During school transportation, <u>CDC's Order</u> applies to all public transportation conveyances including school buses. Passengers and drivers must wear a mask on school buses, including on buses operated by public and private school systems, regardless of vaccination status, subject to the exclusions and exemptions in CDC's Order.

# 2. Physical Distancing and Cohorting:

- a. Within classrooms, maintain 3 feet of physical distancing to the greatest extent practicable, combined with masking for all individuals per <u>EO 251</u>.
- b. Outside of classrooms including in hallways, locker rooms, indoor and outdoor physical education settings, and school-sponsored transportation, maintain physical distancing to the greatest extent practicable.

The CDC recommends a distance of at least 6 feet between students and teachers/staff and between teachers/staff who are not fully vaccinated in all settings.

### 3. Cleaning, Disinfection and Airflow:

Wait as long as possible (at least several hours) before cleaning and disinfection.

#### 4. Outbreaks:

An outbreak in a school setting is defined as <u>three or more</u> laboratory-confirmed (by RT-PCR or antigen) COVID-19 cases among students or staff with onsets within a 14-day period, who are epidemiologically linked, do not share a household, and were not identified as close contacts of each other in another setting during standard case investigation or contact tracing.

## 5. Contact Tracing and Notification:

Exception to close contact in K-12 classroom only - In the K-12 indoor classroom setting, the close contact definition excludes students who were within 3 to 6 feet of an infected student (laboratory-confirmed or a clinically compatible illness) where both the infected student and the exposed student(s) correctly and consistently wore well-fitting masks the entire time. This exception does not apply to teachers, staff, or other adults in the indoor classroom setting. Students within 3 to 6 feet of an infected student should still monitor for symptoms for 14 days after exposure.

Minor updates to the K-12 Screening Testing Guidance includes information on home-based testing, information on available funding to support screening testing and inclusion of high-risk extracurricular activities in the screening testing matrix.
